Dear Inspector General Bialek:

I am writing with extreme concern at recent reports the Biden Administration is targeting certain career civil servants in positions at the Consumer Financial Protection Bureau, and I ask for your immediate investigation.

According to a recent press report, CFPB has "offered separation incentives including early retirement and launched investigations into career senior executives to sideline them, targeting about a half-dozen of the highest-ranked non-political staffers at the bureau."

After the baseless rhetoric regarding President Trump's supposed efforts to create a patronage system² and to damage the federal workforce,³ this stands out as a monument to hypocrisy. Purging career employees who happened to serve under a previous administration specifically because they served under the previous administration could not be more counter to merit-system protection principles.

Given the severity of these allegations, please confirm you intend to investigate them by June 29, 2021.
